The American Indian Community of Santa Clara County will be hosting our 5th Annual American Indian Heritage Celebration in San Jose, California. The theme for this year's celebration is 'Honoring Our Ancestors, Respecting Our Traditions'. The celebration will take place on Saturday, September 18, 2010 from 12 pm to 10 pm at Evergreen Valley College, Gullo 1, Gullo 2 & Gullo 2 lawn area, located at 3095 Yerba Buena Road, San Jose, CA 95135 (2 miles east of HWY 101).

This will be an all-day Celebration, Indian Market, Big Time, and a Powwow that will take us into the night. Many other events will be occurring throughout the day as well, including: American Indian arts and crafts vendors, community information and non-profit booths, a health fair with several health related testing centers and/or interactive displays, tribal information booths, and food booths. There will also be display boards with information on various Tribes and their respective languages, American Indian drumming and music, dance presentations, film & speaker series, cultural crafts and activities, a spiritual run, various sporting contests, a kid's fun zone, and lots of great family fun.

- ◆ **Arts and Crafts Vendor fee is \$75 to set-up a single space booth, size 10'x10'**

YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR BRINGING YOUR OWN CANOPY, TABLES, CHAIRS, GENERATOR AND LIGHTING FOR SET-UP. DO NOT ASK US FOR THESE ITEMS, WE WILL NOT PROVIDE THEM TO YOU.

The AIHC Committee reserves the right to limit the sale of items it finds offensive to American Indian People or specific Tribes (i.e. artifacts, religious or ceremonial items). Vendors may not sell or distribute ceremonial pipes, stems and bowls, cedar, sage, tobacco ties or Kachina dolls.
